Armed Forces Day Celebrations

Progress in Bulford

Aspire Defence Capital Works (ADCW) recently completed one million construction hours for the Army Basing Programme (ABP) at Bulford, where a new home has been created for the Household Cavalry Regiment (HCR). The HCR (Armoured) is relocating from Windsor to Bulford this summer alongside other unit moves within the UK and the return of Service personnel and Service families from Germany.

One of the key buildings delivered at Bulford is the new shared Mess, providing dining and social areas for senior ranks of both the HCR and the Mercian Regiment. The Mess is extensive, with bars, dining areas and kitchens, all constructed to high standards.



The building is surrounded by natural landscaping and parking areas. Soldiers' accommodation blocks are located to both sides of the Mess, with easily accessible routes to the wider camp.



The HCR are also benefitting from modern, purpose-built technical assets at Bulford, including training buildings, workshops, enhanced garaging and regimental headquarters.

Adrian Brice, Project Manager ADCW, said: "The construction of the Mess and accommodation blocks was a real technical challenge and the build programme had to be extended to accommodate this. But no compromise was given on the overall quality and compliance that ABP demands and we now have buildings of which we are immensely proud."
